

Ed Sisson was born in Lebanon, Oregon, and was raised in and around Delta, Colorado. He graduated from Delta High School in 1969. He and his wife Sharon reside in North Delta about fifty yards from where he was raised. They have four daughters, fourteen grandchildren, and four great grandchildren between them.

Ed joined the U.S. Navy right out high school. Serving from October 1, 1969 until January 31, 1990. While in the Navy he attended schools at Treasure Island, and San Diego, CA, Orlando, FL, and Yokosuka, Japan. He traveled the world aboard three aircraft carriers, the USS Oriskany, USS Coral Sea, USS Carl Vinson, and troop carrier USS Anchorage. Also stationed at Training Squadron Twenty One, Kingsville, TX, Naval Air Station Agana, Guam, Navy Recruiting District Houston, TX, Attack Squadron Ninety Seven at Lemoore, CA. His last assignment was as senior Navy liaison/classifier for Navy Recruiting District Albuquerque at the Military Entrance and Processing Station Amarillo, TX. He retired from the Navy January 31, 1990 as a Personnelman pt Class/Air Warfare. During his Naval career he made six western Pacific cruises and one world cruise.

Spent a couple of years at various jobs while finishing classes at Amarillo College, and West Texas A & M

University in Canyon, TX earning a degree in Business Administration prior to joining the Veterans Administration at the VA hospital in Amarillo, TX. Transferred in the VA Hospital in Grand Junction in August 2001 and retired from the VA system in April 2013.

Became interested in local government 2006 and was elected to the Delta City Council in 2010 on the premise of "I have one mouth and two ears and plan to use each accordingly." Selected as Mayor in 2012, and again in 2014. Also serves as Adhoc city council member to the Delta Chamber of Commerce Board of Directors, and as a member of the Colorado Municipal League Policy Committee which meets in Denver four times per year.
